#### **How It All Began**

Late in 1999, Jere Murphy, MC High School principal, and Dr. Carol Saylor, superintendent of Manheim Central School District, discussed the possibility of starting an education foundation for the district. This foundation would serve as a "booster club" for academics and support programs that enhance and enrich the educational experience for MC students. After researching the success and challenges of other districts' foundations, lere met with more than 90 alumni, parents, business and civic leaders, and academic advocates to discuss the concept of an education foundation for Manheim Central. As a result of these discussions, 21 eager individuals were recruited to serve as the original leadership board for MCFEE. On January 19, 2001, the Manheim Central Foundation For Educational Enrichment was incorporated in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as a community-based, taxexempt organization dedicated to expanding educational opportunities for students in the public schools of Manheim Central School District.

To meet the capital needs required to sustain the mission of MCFEE, the Trustee Council initiated a Founders Campaign in

February 2001. Passionate supporters – willing to invest \$5,000 or more in a dream with no track record – were sought out by the leadership team. By June 2003, 41 founders were successfully recruited, raising in excess of \$225,000. The strength of MCFEE, today, would not have been possible without the enthusiastic backing of these original founders who saw the potential and believed in a concept that would benefit students for the next decade.

From 2001 through today, MCFEE has been led by a team of 21 devoted leaders, committed to the organization's success by serving a term of three years or more. A listing of the current MCFEE Trustee Council is included on the back cover.

#### A Legacy Worth Perpetuating

Ten years ago, a group of new trustees pondered the question, "What does it take to turn a dream into a reality ... and have the reality ultimately become a legacy?" Mulling over options on how to raise seed money to launch this new venture, it became apparent to these members they had no track record of success on which to base a capital campaign.

One decade later, our story of success is the envy of many educational foundations across Pennsylvania. MCFEE has funded countless artists, musicians and authors, as well as purchased technology and equipment for Manheim Central students at all grade levels. These projects are outside the scope of normal funding from the school district's annual budget and have exceeded \$750,000.

Since its beginning, MCFEE trustees have had a goal of creating a one million dollar endowment fund to bridge those unforeseen lean years in fundraising. Over the past ten years, the Board of Trustees has managed the finances of MCFEE and set aside nearly half of this goal.
