Cutting Edge Technology

A plasma cam is an exciting new addition to the Agriculture Department this year, thanks to a MCFEE Educational Innovation Grant. The machine uses the existing plasma cutter in the Ag Mechanics class and pairs it with a computer-controlled table to cut plate steel. As a result, the 80+ students who take this entry-level class each year are expanding their skillsets. One area of focus has been a shelf project that incorporates a metal insert, customized by each student with the use of the plasma cam.

Teacher, Jonathan Werning, submitted the \$14,802 grant request in hopes that his students would have the opportunity to incorporate technology currently used in the industry setting while still in high school. He loves the creativity that has been sparked as a result.

The students have responded with a sense of pride and motivation as they deepen their classroom experience. "It's nice to have the knowledge about the auto CAD and the program. It adds variety to our projects," shared Landon Stoner. "You can basically do anything in metal that you can imagine," explained Ryan Carter. Juan Spencer added, "I think it's cool to do ideas that you come up with. The sky's the limit!"
